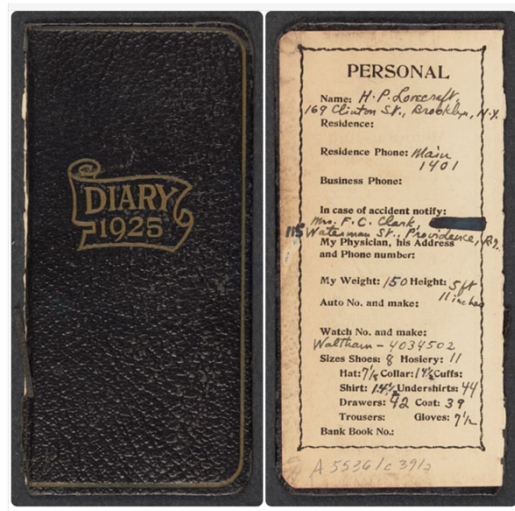

Inspector Belton's Baby Is First in 1925; First Fire Alarm False; Woman Shot in Bed

The first baby of the New Year on record in this city was an eight-pound girl, born to Mrs. Samuel G. Belton, wife of Deputy Chief Police Inspector Samuel G. Belton, in charge of the Special Service Division.

The baby was born in the Women's and Children's Infirmary, Sixtieth Street and Second Avenue, at one minute past midnight this morning. Young Miss Belton arrived while the shrieking of whistles and the din of bells and horns was at its peak.

The first fire alarm of the year was a false alarm, turned in by a celebrator who could not be found when the apparatus arrived. This alarm was turned in at 12:01.

Some one celebrating the incoming year fired six shots in the rear yard of 360 Douglas Street, Brooklyn, just after midnight this morning.

One bullet entered a bedroom window and penetrated the left thigh of Mrs. Nora Mulderig, 38 years old, as she lay in bed. She was removed to the Holy Family Hospital. It was said that her condition was not serious.

Detectives of the Bergen Street Precinct found the five other bullets in the wall of the house. They learned that a man had entered the yard from the house opposite the Mulderig home in the rear, but were unable to learn the identity of the celebrator who fired the shots. They are still investigating.

Frank Belknap Long sera probablement l'ami que Lovecraft aura le plus fréquenté, et à New York et ensuite. Le 31 décembre 1924 correspond à son installation dans sa chambre du 169 Clinton Street, à Brooklyn Heights, tandis que Sonia, son épouse, a trouvé un travail à Cincinnati et qu'il a refusé de l'y accompagner. Le déménagement correspond à l'ouverture du carnet où chaque jour, toute l'année à partir de ce 1^{er} janvier il va noter ses occupations quotidiennes.

New York Times, 1^{er} janvier 1925. Rockaway Avenue, à Brooklyn, un automobiliste renverse un enfant de sept ans, qui meurt en arrivant à l'hôpital. Un des enfants qui jouait avec le premier (Dominick Cicio) a relevé l'immatriculation mais le chauffard s'est enfui. Pris de vertiges, Sydney Lebel, vingt-cinq ans, un livreur de chez Steinway, revenant à l'usine, a voulu arrêter son camion mais en a perdu le contrôle. Tentant de descendre il a glissé sous les roues arrière et a été tué. Un nommé Bernard Friedman, de Newark, a renversé la petite Stella Oven, onze ans. Au même moment, une petite fille non identifiée a été tuée par une automobile à Harrison, New Jersey. Dans le Bronx, la nuit dernière, traversant pour échapper à un soudain écroulement dans un chantier Anderson Avenue, Daniel De Lora, trente-sept ans, a été renversé par une voiture conduite par Fred Brumester, d'Ogden Avenue dans le Bronx. Un homme et deux femmes blessés dans une collision Park Avenue, le conducteur de l'autre automobile, James H Peckam, a été déféré en justice pour conduite dangereuse. Louis Zuckerman, vingt-deux ans, a été blessé quand son camion a heurté un train à Patchogue, Long Island, son état est sérieux. Un taxi conduit par William Rice, de Glendale dans le Queens, a heurté sur la 3^{ème} Avenue Mme Grace Mahoney, soixante-six ans, infirmière, lui occasionnant une fracture du crâne, état critique. James Gallagher, quarante ans, sans adresse connue, a été renversé sur la 1^{ère} Avenue par un véhicule conduit par Benjamin Meyer, de Brooklyn. Une voiture conduite par Sadio Resucci, Elmhurst, a renversé Mme Marie Tragrazdeio, soixante-quinze ans, revenant chez elle Corona Avenue dans le Queens.
