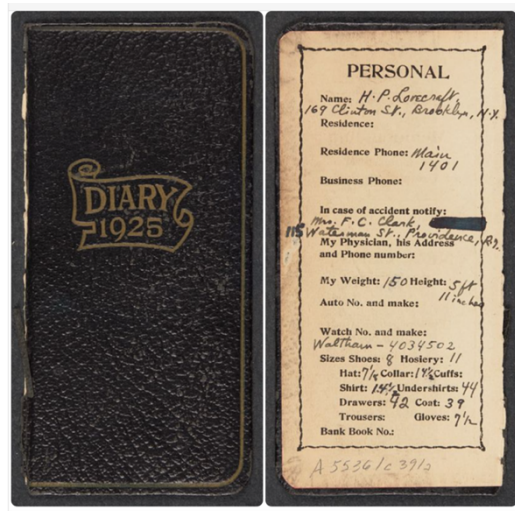

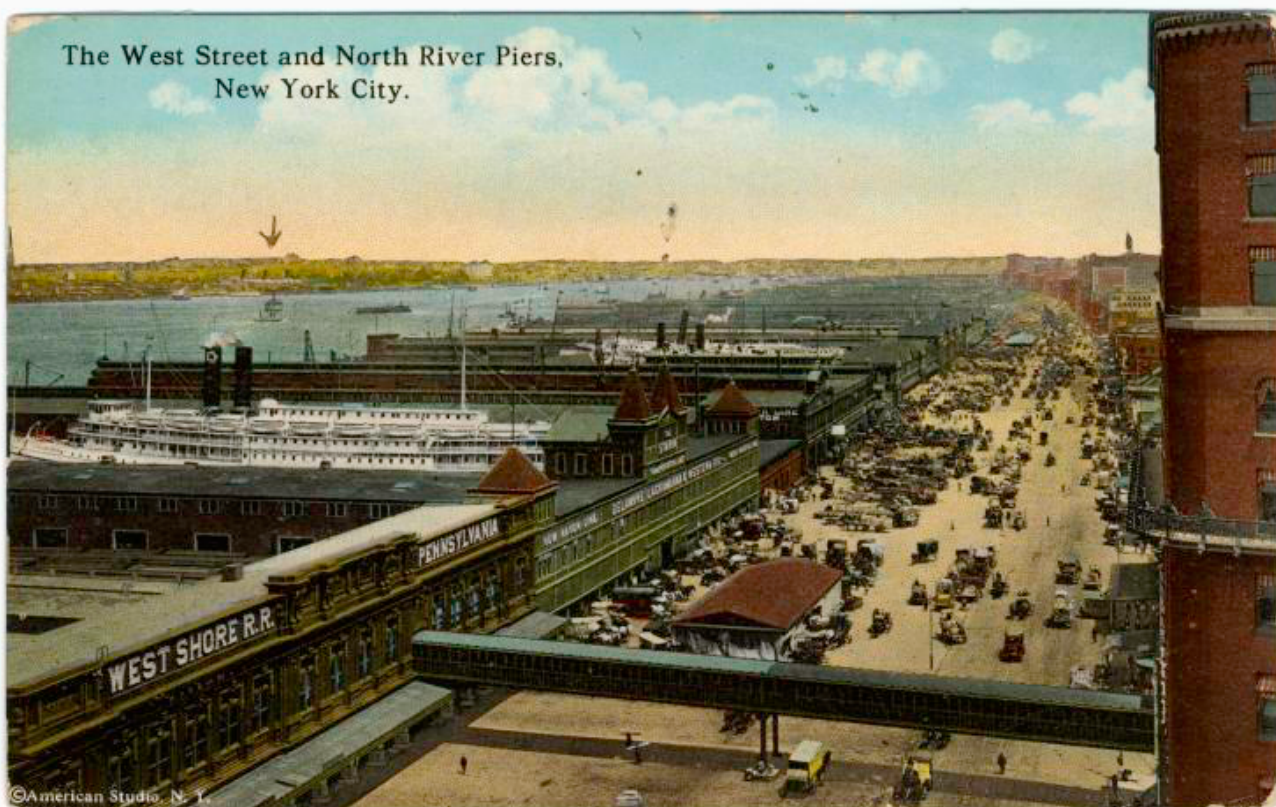

Qui parmi nous aurait marché dans New York, ou descendu l'East River au crépuscule, sans porter à jamais, de la ville des villes, son *skyline* ? Les petits arrangements de célibataires : disposer d'un double de la clé de Loveman, reprendre à la laverie son linge propre. Le paquet express : on peut supposer qu'il envoie à Cincinnati, pour Sonia, un complément de ses affaires personnelles, ou alors une commande de fournisseur dont elle aurait besoin pour son travail ? ECONOMIST FINDS THE WORLD IS SICK

Dr. Derry Says Nation Needs
More of the Moral Power That
Comes From the Home.

SEES THE LAWS IGNORED

Declares Only an Optimist Can Con-
template Conditions Without
Dismay.

Dr. George H. Derry, Professor of Economics at Union University, in a discussion last night at the Catholic Club of political and social conditions under the topic "Molding the Popular Will in the Republic," said that things were in such a deplorable state that "only an optimist could contemplate them without being dismayed." The story of the last ten years, he said, had been one of attacks upon ideals and civilization.

"The world, my friends, is sick; sick unto death. What the people need, if democracy is to continue, is a power to control the people, and a power which the people cannot control. The larger part of the press has done a wonderful work in constructive effort. In the holding up of ideals and advancement. But there has been also a gutter press, a yellow press at times, which gives the people what they want. Where are we to find the proper power?"

"It is to be found in religion only, aided by the moral laws. What the nation needs is more of that moral power that comes from the home and religion. Without it people vote as their selfish interests dictate or their prejudices impel them, with no regard to the making of just laws or of enforcing them. Education may help. But Roosevelt has said that the educated crook was the worst of all."

"In what I may term a spiritual vivisection of the lives of our great men, our leaders of the nation—Washington, Lincoln, Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson and President Coolidge, and all the others of like character—what do we find to be the one great dynamic force of character?"

"In a study made by an assistant at the university, and the results of which I have verified, it was found that the influences of character-building upon these men consisted: of 5 per cent. collegiate education; 20 per cent. elementary school education, and 75 per cent. due to the religious influence and training in the home, the influence of the Christian mother in the Christian home."
